Within our label's artwork are nods to his conquest in the Battle of Lake Erie which took place near Ohio's South Bass Island, including strips of sailcloth and our cheeky take on his legendary battle flag: "Don't Give Up the Sip!"

ABOUT THE STYLE:

English IPAs likely originated as Pale Ales prepared for shipment to India in the late 1700s and early 1800s. Today's English IPAs may have less in common with those original brews, but they tend to feature high hop flavor and bitterness balanced by a bready, biscuit-like malt body. Unlike the American IPA, English IPAs may be slightly dryer and more balanced.
